






What is a Land Trust?


 A land trust is a non-profit community organization that takes an active role in influencing development in a community by acquiring land through purchase or gift and preserving it as open space.

 There are many reasons to want to preserve open space in Attleboro. For its natural beauty, agricultural use, recreational value, groundwater protection, and wildlife habitat, to name a few.

 A land trust can take positive action to prevent unwanted and unwise development before it is too late. While it can work closely with government agencies, a land trust also has the freedom to work independently.

 A land trust can work with a landowner to devise the best possible strategy for selling a piece of property, so that the maximum amount of land is preserved, while still allowing the landowner to get the benefit of the property's full market value.

 A land trust can also be a source of community pride.
